Liquidators' First Report

AMAC Limited (In Liquidation)

1. Appointment

We advise that Karen Betty Mason and Lloyd James Hayward were appointed joint and several Liquidators of the above company on 21 March 2006 by special resolution of shareholders.

Karen Mason and Lloyd Hayward are full time Insolvency Practitioners. They have not previously acted in any capacity for the company or the officers and shareholders of the company.

2. Background

3. Events Leading to Appointment

The director advised that the company had experienced steadily reducing sales revenues from June 2005 and that this resulted in poor profitability. Further the company had not paid IRD debt dating back to July 2004.

The director/shareholder concluded (after taking advise) that the company was insolvent and resolved to place the company into liquidation.



4. Statement of Affairs

The Liquidators have prepared an Estimated Statement of Affairs being the assets and liabilities of the company at the date of liquidation. We attach a copy.

5. Proposals for Conducting the Liquidation

5.1 Realisation of Assets

The company's assets consist of trade debt, motor vehicles, plant & equipment, loose tools and supplies.

Trade debt will be recovered in accordance with the company's terms and conditions, any unpaid debt will be referred to collection agents. All other assets will be sold by way of public auction or private treaty.

5.2 Investigations

The Liquidators will review the company's books and records, conduct an initial investigation into the trading affairs of the company and conduct all other investigations that the Liquidators are charged to do.

6. Creditors Claim Form

Creditors should complete and return the attached Creditor's claim form by 26 April 2006. Creditors who do not make a claim within the period may be excluded from any distribution that may be made.

7. Retention of Title Claims/Security Interests

Please note, if you believe you have a valid retention of title claim or security interest over goods or equipment supplied to AMAC Limited (In Liquidation), and you have not yet contacted the Liquidators, please contact us immediately.

8. Initial Creditors Meeting

As it is unlikely there will be a distribution to creditors, pursuant to s245 of the Companies Act 1993 the Liquidators propose to dispense with the meeting of creditors to consider whether to appoint different Liquidators, and to consider the views of creditors.

Accordingly a meeting of creditors will not be called unless a creditor gives notice to the Liquidators within 10 working days after receiving this notice, requiring a meeting to be called.

9. Liquidation Committee

At any time during the liquidation, any creditor may in writing, request the Liquidators to call a meeting of creditors to consider whether a Liquidation Committee should be appointed, and if so, to choose the members of the Committee.

A Liquidation Committee has certain powers set out in s315 of the Companies Act 1993, including to assist the Liquidators as appropriate in the conduct of the liquidation.

10. Estimated Date of Completion of Liquidation

It is not practicable to estimate the date of completion of the liquidation at this stage.
